Next **Tuesday, 8th December** is the **Feast of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary,** and is a holiday of obligation. Masses for this feast day will be celebrated in our church at 6p.m. on Monday, (Vigil Mass) and at 10a.m. & 1p.m. on Tuesday.

The **Society of St. Vincent De Paul** will be holding its annual **Christmas Appeal** collection at all Masses next weekend, 12th & 13th December. It will replace the Share collection.

A reminder: There will be no 10a.m. Mass on Saturday mornings until further notice.

Archbishop Martin has written to ask parishioners to support the collection of non-perishable food items for **Crosscare Food Banks**. Food items can be brought to our church after all Masses this weekend and next weekend (12th & 13th Dec.). Throughout 2015, demand on these Food Banks remained very high with more families turning to Crosscare for support with basic food items.

Application for membership of the **Pioneer Total Abstinence Association** will be taken in the Conference Room at the side of the Church from 11:30a.m. to 12:30p.m. today (Sunday).

The **Jubilee Year of Mercy** will be inaugurated on 8th December 2015, the feast of the Immaculate Conception and will run until 20th November 2016 which is the solemnity of Christ the King. This year, declared by Pope Francis, will highlight the love, forgiveness and mercy of God.

The Advent Wreath is a circular wreath of evergreens. The circle is a symbol of eternity and a reminder that God has no beginning or end. The evergreen is a symbol of eternal life and a reminder that God is unchangeable. The candles represent the four weeks of Advent. Three of the candles are purple, reminding us of the penitential nature of the season. The pink candle is lit on the third Sunday of Advent, reminding us to rejoice that Christmas is nigh.
